This strategic initiative not only prepared our athletes for their future beyond active competition but also underscored our commitment to providing them with the necessary tools and education for success outside of sports.

As we transitioned through the year, our collective efforts culminated in a remarkable performance at the 2023 Solomon Islands Pacific Games, where Team PNG's contingent of 483 athletes and 22 team officials showcased their exceptional talents across 21 sports, securing a total of 105 medals. This achievement stands as a testament to the unwavering spirit and dedication of our athletes, supported by the commitment and funding from our corporate sponsors, Kumul Consolidated Holdings, and the Papua New Guinea government.

Introduction

As we conclude the year 2023, I am pleased to report that the Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee (PNGOC) has made significant progress in delivering key programs and activities against our 2021-2024 Strategic Plan. Despite the challenges we faced, we remained committed to our mission of inspiring and uniting Papua New Guinea through sporting excellence and success.

2023 signifies the end of the Pacific Games year for another quadrennial as we set our eyes and targets onto Paris for the Olympic Games in 2024. I am always pleased to report and state that our strategic plan is a living and breathing document that is reported and discussed at the board and general assembly level. We have set targets across four key focus areas with set measures to monitor and report on the progress. I am pleased to report, under the leadership of the current Executive, that the majority of the targets have been met.

The Secretary General's report is a review of 2023 through our four key result areas built into our strategic plan for 2021-2024, and how we are measuring up as we head into the final term of the strategic plan itself, and the completion of another Olympiad.

Key Focus Area 1 – Excellence Embodied and Strategic Partnerships

In early February of 2023, we conducted a mid-term review of the current 2021-2024 Strategic Plan for the organization through consultation with National Federations and stakeholders. This review allowed us to assess our progress, take stock of our current operations, and identify any lessons learned that can be incorporated into the planning



and development of the new strategic plan Moving forward.

Throughout the year, the Executive Board has diligently fulfilled its governance oversight responsibilities by attending scheduled meetings and making effective contributions



to the organization's objectives. I would like to express my sincere gratitude to each Executive for their invaluable contribution and time throughout the year, especially those who served on multiple committees due to their knowledge and skillset.

In June, we held our Assembly where our annual Annual General report was tabled and approved. An update on the audited financials, which were not available at the time, was provided. To fulfill our financial reporting obligations to our members, a Special General Meeting was called in September to formally table and accept the audited financials. This process and adherence to audited financial reporting are important to provide confidence in the financial management of the organization.



Our commercial program would not have been successful without the great support of our family of corporate partners including: Kumul Consolidated Holdings, Trukai Industries Ltd, Air Nuigini, SP Brewery Ltd, Coral Sea Hotels, IBS University, Theodist, The National, Jacks of PNG, Trophy Haus, Vanguard International, Media Partners and Blue7 Team.



We continued several prominent Team PNG fundraising initiatives, such as the Trukai auctions and Trukai Fun Run, as well as the respective Prime Minister's Corporate Golf Challenges in Lae and Port Moresby. The funds raised from these initiatives were crucial in supporting our participation at the 2023 Solomon Islands Pacific Games.



Under the leadership of Michael Henao, we were able to successfully re-negotiate the terms of our Trukai Fun Run sponsorship agreement and secure Jacks of PNG as an official sponsor for Team PNG at the 2023 Solomon Islands Pacific Games.



Recognising sporting achievements in 2022, the SP Sports Awards 2023 was successfully delivered together with partners PNG Sports Foundation and SP Brewery. Morea Baru from the sport of Weightlifting and Violet Apisah from Tennis took out the major awards for Male and Female Athlete of the Year respectively.



We remain committed to fostering a workplace culture that inspires collaboration, empowers individuals, and cultivates the importance of diversity, equity and inclusion. Staff performance was recognised through monthly awards and staff professional development saw several staff attend key courses and seminars nationally and internationally throughout the year.



Key Result Area 2 – Consistent Success for Team PNG

Planning and preparations in a Pacific Games calendar year are a mammoth task, made possible through the combination of support from our international bodies. We would like to give special mention to Olympic Solidarity and our key partner Kumul Consolidated Holdings for their invaluable support. It is important to recognize that our participation and the results achieved at the 2023 Pacific Games are an indirect result of the investments made into Team PNG.



We would like to acknowledge and thank the team at the High-Performance Sport PNG unit and the National Sports Institute for their collaboration with the National Federations. Their efforts have greatly aided the preparations of athletes and teams, from individual to team optimization, rehabilitation, and the necessary screening and fitness tests. We encourage National Federations to continue engaging with both High - Performance Sport PNG and the National Sports Institute in preparation for their respective qualification events in 2024 and beyond.



Led by Chef de Mission, Iammo Launa, our young team of athletes attended the Commonwealth Youth Games in Trinidad & Tobago from 4th to 11th August, competing in Athletics and Swimming. The Youth Games are an important pathway for our young athletes as they pursue their sporting careers.







Under the watchful eyes of Chef de Mission Ms Faye-Zina Lalo, Team PNG participated in the 2023 Solomon Islands Pacific Games. We sent a contingent of 483 athletes and 22 team officials, and we are proud to announce that we finished 5th out of 24 participating nations. Our athletes performed admirably, collecting 29 gold, 37 silver, and 39 bronze medals, resulting in a total medal tally of 105 medals. This participation was made possible through the facilitation of the Sports Minister, the Honorable Don Pomb Polye, and the PNG Sports Foundation Executive Director Mr. Albert Veratau and his team. Out of government's commitment of K8.5 million, K4 million was received and catered for accommodation, per diems, insurance, shipment, consumables, and games-related expenses. We would like to express our gratitude to the PNG Sports Foundation for facilitating the direct payment of K1.9 million to Air Niugini, securing multiple flights to and from Honiara for the duration of the games.



Support for Team PNG goes a long way, and we would like to acknowledge the government funding sources that made our participation possible, including the Department of Treasury, National Gaming Control Board, and Kumul Mineral Holdings.

I would like to extend my special acknowledgement and thanks to the athletes, National Federations, Chef de Mission Ms Faye-Zina Lalo and her management team for their tireless work and commitment over an intensive two weeks of competition. I would also like to express my gratitude to the outgoing and retiring athletes and officials for their years of service to Team PNG. They are the embodiment of our values of respect and excellence.



Key Result Area 3 – Develop the Solidarity and Capability of National Federations and Athletes

The Oceania Sports Education Program (OSEP) and its associated courses remained our primary capacity building courses that were run throughout the duration of 2023, especially in the lead-up to the 2023 Solomon Islands Pacific Games. OSEP is a tool that we will continue to use and leverage to enhance and improve our games preparation heading into the new Olympiad.

OSEP selected courses aim to enhance the preparation of athletes and officials for major sporting events, such as the Pacific Games and the Olympics.



At the Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee, we are not just about our teams attending multi-sporting events on an annual basis. OSEP remains our flagship program to build the capacity of our member and affiliate National Federations through our delivery partners, including the National Sports Institute, High-Performance Sports PNG, and the PNG Sports Foundation. In 2023 alone, we were able to generate a new line of Team Managers, Development Coaches, Community Coaches, and Strength and Conditioning Coaches as prerequisite courses to be attained by endorsed 2023 Pacific Games sports.

Apart from the OSEP courses, the organization successfully delivered the Olympic Solidarity Managing Olympic Sporting Organisation courses throughout the year. We also recognize National Federations that adhere to, and successfully complete the organization's annual audit of compliance, which respects the ethical principles enshrined in the Olympic Charter. Successful National Federations that completed the annual audit of compliance were recipients of administration grants in 2023.

Capacity building opportunities were also provided to our athletes through our long-standing sponsorship with the IBS University, which continues to provide 20 scholarships to our former and current Team PNG athletes. We have a responsibility to ensure we prepare our athletes for life after sports.





In early October, we ran our flagship athlete leadership HERO program to identify, equip, and induct the next generation of sporting HEROs to spread the Olympic Values within their communities, sport, and through our existing programs. It is our goal to have multiple sporting HEROs across all member and affiliate National Federations.

As we enter the end of another strategic term, our delivery of these programs, but more importantly, the engagement of National Federations with these respective programs, will be vital in impacting the growth of each athlete and sports in the country as a whole.



We acknowledge and recognize the role and contribution of the Athletes Commission led by Chairperson, Ryan Pini in advocating the voice of the athletes and ensuring athlete welfare and wellbeing in all decisions affecting athletes.

Key Result Area 4 – Sport in Society

In line with our commitment to sustainable development, we recognize the pivotal role of sports as a platform to serve our communities and the environment. At the Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee, we actively promote the values of Olympism and engage in initiatives that contribute to the well-being of our society. This is made possible through our collaboration with Olympic Solidarity and the generous support of our sponsors, ExxonMobil, enabling our athlete ambassadors to graduate from our HERO program and deliver Olympic Values Education Programs throughout PNG.

In partnership with the Kokoda Track Foundation, we successfully delivered a series of soccer tournaments through the Kicks4Kokoda campaign, fostering community engagement and promoting the spirit of sportsmanship, and community health messages.



Our activities for the year also included the Olympic week and Olympic Day celebrations being held on June 23rd at Ela Beach with a series of games and activities with Olympians and elite athletes under the “Let’s Move” campaign.



Conclusion

As we eagerly look towards the future, the Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee is poised to enter a new strategic era and targeted planning, filled with optimism and determination to achieve even greater accomplishments alongside our National Federations, corporate partners, and the government. We are fortunate to be served by an experienced and highly credentialed collective of sports administrators on our Executive Board and Committees, who are passionately investing in the growth and future of our organization and the respective games movements we serve.



While we acknowledge the challenges we faced in 2023, we are fully committed to addressing them head-on in the coming years. Through strategic initiatives and proactive measures, we aim to overcome obstacles and drive positive change within the organization and the broader sports community.

As this will be my last report as Secretary General, I wish to acknowledge the National Federations, the back bone of sport in this country. It has been an absolute honor serving you and working with you, enabling Papua New Guineans to excel through sport.

Our valued corporate partners and stakeholders, all identified in this report, thank you for believing in us and continuing to support PNGOC and our direction. Your contribution provides the means to allow Team PNG to excel and PNGOC to continue its pursuit of excellence.

Assisting PNGOC are our committees made up of volunteers who give generously their time to assist Board and Secretariat achieve the priorities of our key result areas. My sincere thanks to those that served on the Athletes Commission, Justification Committee, Admin Committee, Audit & Investment Committee, Marketing & Revenue Committee, Uniform Committee, Gender Equity Committee; Team PNG Performance Committee and the Team PNG General Management teams.

The work of the Secretariat thrives on the professionalism and hard work of the board and staff of the organization. My utmost thanks and appreciation to our Board for your outstanding leadership and voluntary services. PNGOC's organisational growth, financial stability, strong standing and credibility within the Olympic and Sports Movement nationally and internationally is a result of your strong governance oversight and leadership. You have been integral to the important advances we have made both for PNGOC and Team PNG.

Report on the audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

We have audited the Financial Report of Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee Inc. (the "Committee").

In our opinion, the accompanying Financial Report of the Committee is in accordance with the *Associations Incorporation Act 2023*, including giving a true and fair view of the Committee's financial position as at 31 December 2023 and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date.

The Financial Report comprises:

- statement of financial position as at 31 December 2023;
- statement of comprehensive income, statement of cash flows for the year then ended; and
- notes including a summary of significant accounting policies.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the *International Standards on Auditing*. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the Financial Report* section of our report.

We are independent of the Committee in accordance with the ethical requirements of the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the Financial Report in Papua New Guinea. We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We confirm that we have remained independent as required by the Code throughout the period of our audit and to the date of this Auditor's Report.

Basis of accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The special purpose financial statements have been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Executive Committee's financial reporting responsibilities under the *Associations Incorporation Act 2023*. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose.

Our opinion on the Financial Report does not cover the Other Information and, accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion or any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the Financial Report, our responsibility is to read the Other Information. In doing so, we consider whether the Other Information is materially inconsistent with the Financial Report or our knowledge obtained in the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

We are required to report if we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this Other Information, and based on the work we have performed on the Other Information that we obtained prior to the date of this Auditor's Report we have nothing to report.

Responsibilities of the Executive Committee for the Financial Report

The Executive Committee is responsible for:

- preparing the Financial Report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with the *International Financial Reporting Standards* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 2023*;
- determining that the basis of preparation and accounting policies described in note 1 to the financial report are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Committee's constitution and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members;
- implementing necessary internal control to enable the preparation of a Financial Report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; and
- assessing the Committee's ability to continue as a going concern and whether the use of the going concern basis of accounting is appropriate. This includes disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless they either intend to liquidate the Committee or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal controls.



Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the Financial Report (continued)

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Committee's internal control.

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

The auditor communicates with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that the auditor identifies during the audit.

The auditor also provides those charged with governance with a statement that the auditor has complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on the auditor's independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Report on other legal and regulatory requirements

We have obtained all the information and explanations, which, to the best of our knowledge and belief, were necessary for the purposes of our audit.

In our opinion proper books of account have been kept by the Committee, sufficient to enable financial statements to be prepared, so far as it appears from our examination of those books; and to the best of our knowledge and according to the information and explanations given to us the financial statements give the information required by the *Associations Incorporation Act 2023*, in the manner so required.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee Inc. is an association domiciled in Papua New Guinea. The address of the associations' registered office is at Section 25 Lot 21 Lahara Avenue, Port Moresby, National Capital District Papua New Guinea. The association's principal activity is a non-government organization that represents the interests of its members, the National Sports Federations.

The Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee Inc. includes the National Olympic Committee, The Commonwealth Games Association, The Pacific Games Association, and the Fund-Raising Committee.

The financial statements were approved at the Executive Committee Members Meeting held on the 18th June 2024.

(a) Subsidiary

The Papua New Guinea Olympic Committee Inc. owned 100% of the PNG 2015 Pacific Games Organising Committee, PNG 2015 Pacific Games Ltd. The investment in subsidiary is shown at nominal value representing value of share capital subscription. The investment was dissolved on the 2nd of May 2023.

(b) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies as determined by the Association's executive committee that is consistent with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the financial reporting requirements as per the Association's constitution. The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis applying the accrual accounting concept.

Special purpose financial statements

This is a special purpose financial report for the sole purpose of providing financial information to the members and must not be used for any other purpose.

The association is an exempt organization in accordance with Section 171 of the Companies Act 1997 as the members have elected to be exempt under Section 171 (1b).

(i) Presentation of financial statements

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements and have been applied consistently by the Association.

(ii) Foreign currency transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate at the date of the transaction. Foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the exchange rate at the balance date. Resulting exchange differences are recognised in the profit and loss account for the year. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currency are recorded at the exchange rate at the date of the transaction.

(iii) Property, plant and equipment

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at original cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation is provided on cost amount of all fixed assets, including buildings so as to write off the assets progressively over their estimated useful lives. Fixed assets are first depreciated in the year of acquisition.

(iv) Impairment

The carrying amounts of all assets are reviewed at each balance date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment.

(v) Investment property

Investment property is stated at cost.

(vi) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation.

(vii) Taxation

The association is exempt from income tax under Section 27(b) of the PNG Income Tax Act as a sporting body.

(viii) Revenue

The major source of revenue for the association is grants and sponsorship income. Revenue is recognised when the funds are received.

(ix) Provisional reserve

The association allocates grants and sponsorship income to individual projects. The excess of such allocated income over expenditure are transferred from the Statement of comprehensive income into a "Provisional Reserve" and included as "Funds held in Trust" in the Statement of Financial Position.

(x) Cash & cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand, cash in banks and investments in money market instruments, net of outstanding bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities in the statement of assets and commitments.

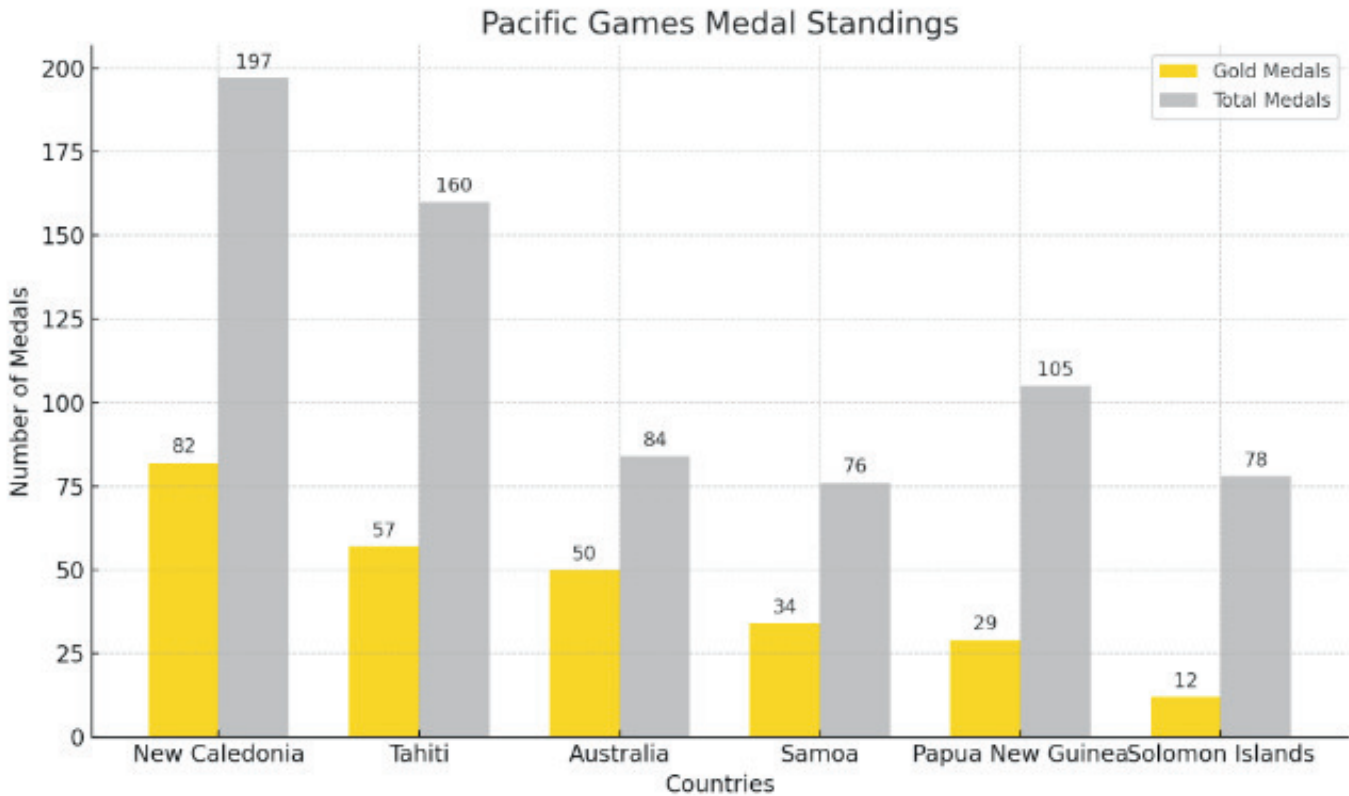

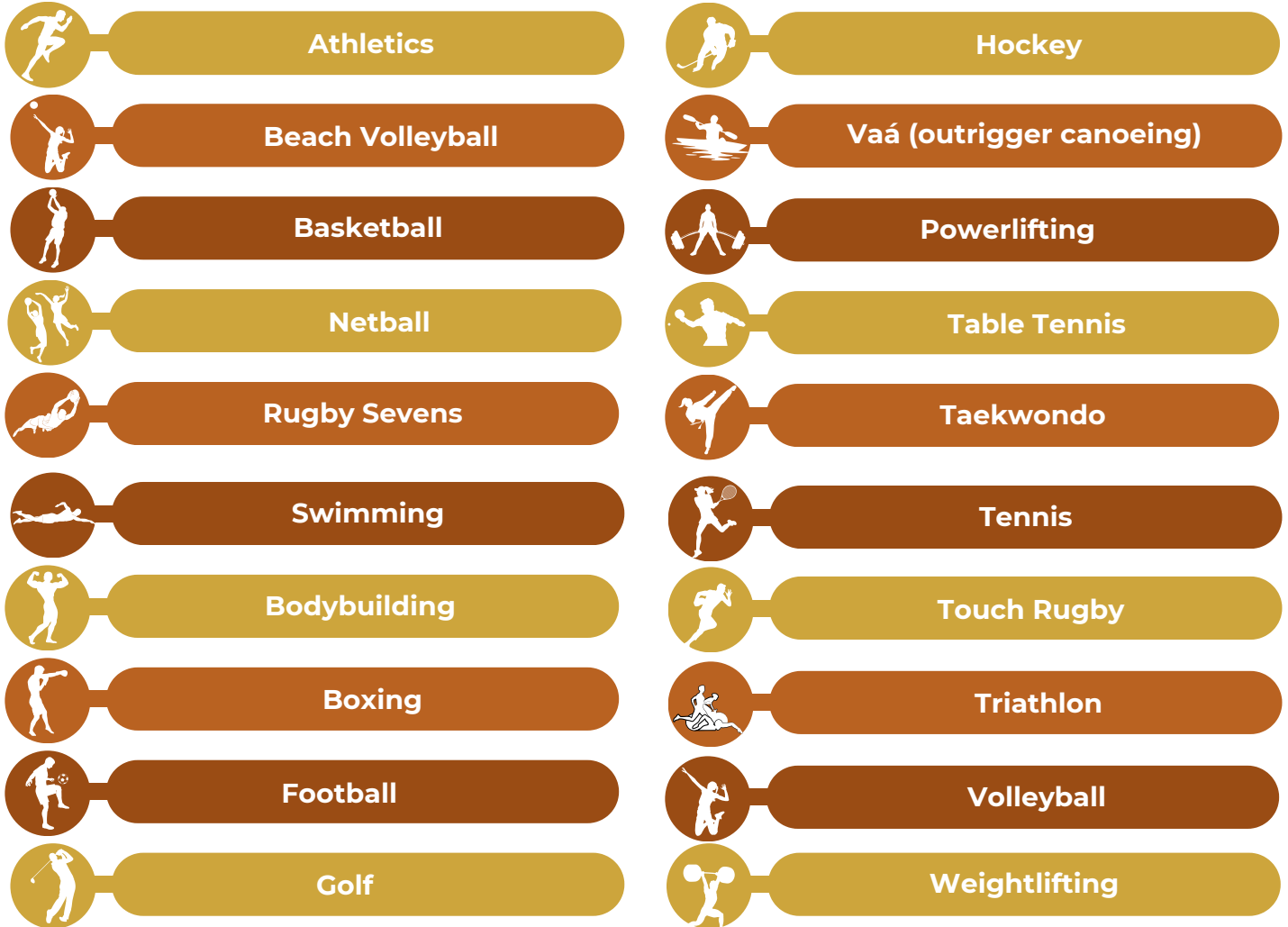

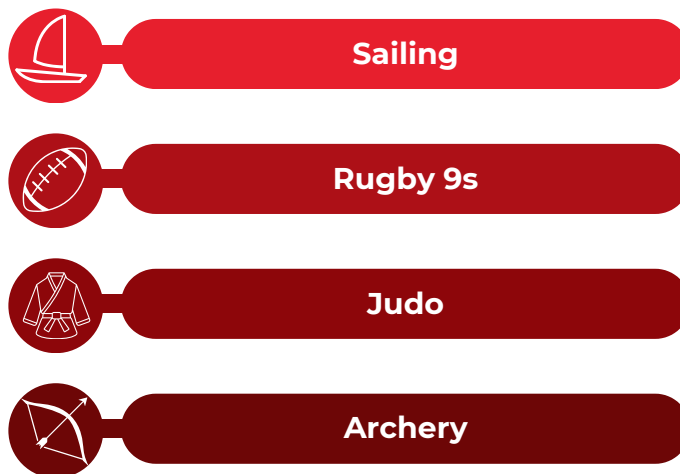

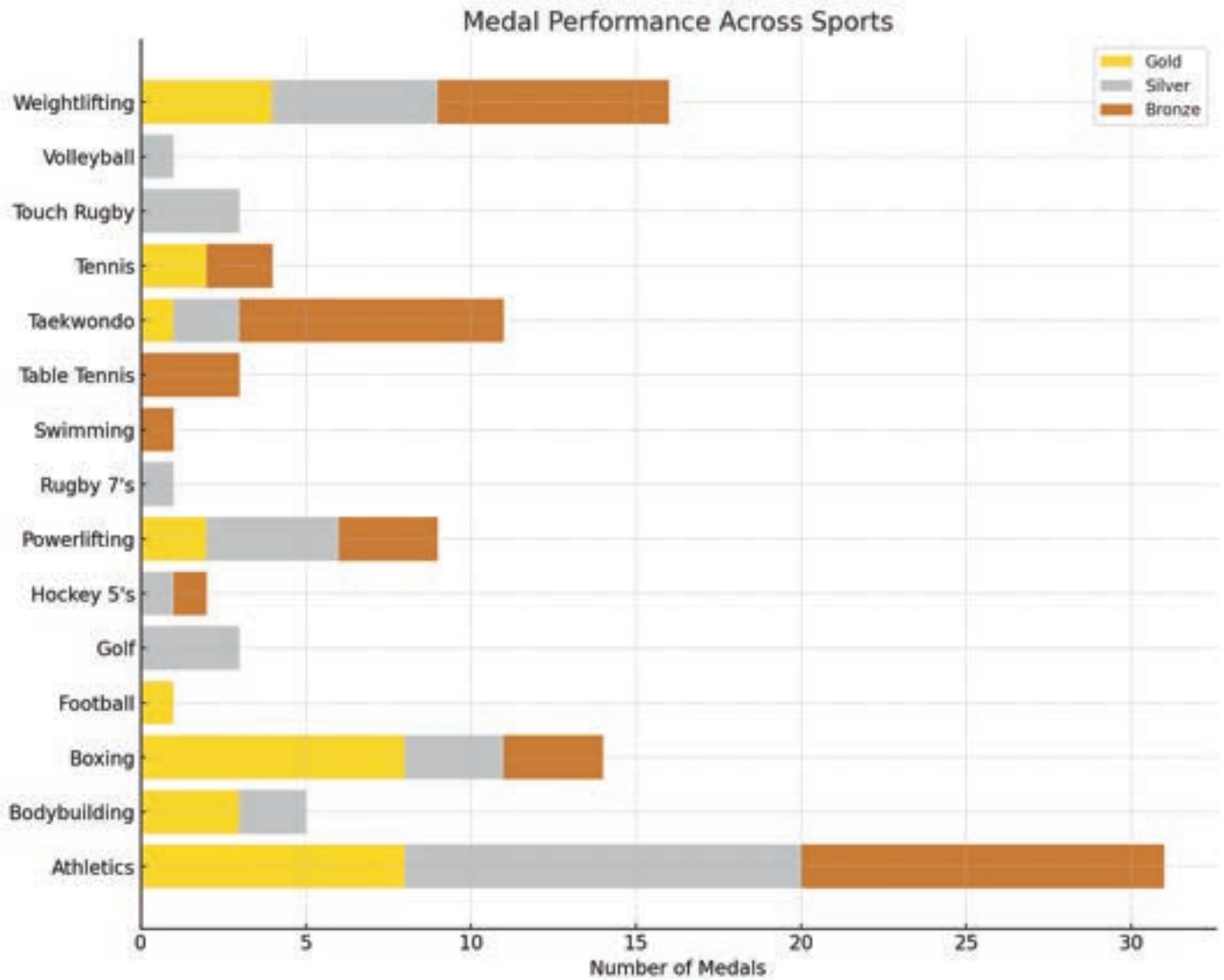
Sports Team PNG Participated In

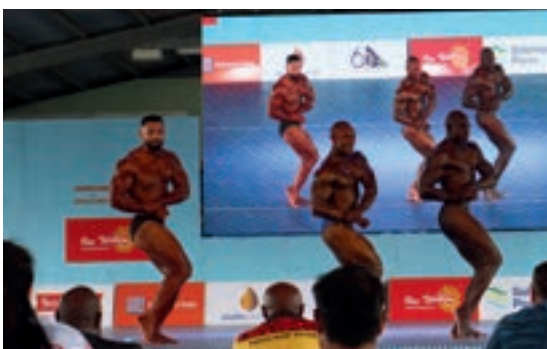
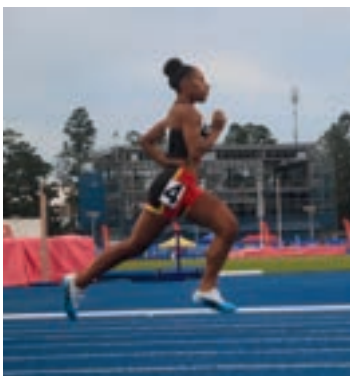
